WORKS IN PROGRESS:

1) *Human-Nonhuman Interaction*: Interaction stands at the heart of the sociological tradition, as we study how individuals act and react in relation to one another. Typically, sociologists have attended almost exclusively to exchanges between humans. But in the past two decades, some are actively questioning these human-only restrictions. Such developments are leading many scholars to argue for revisions in our approach to social interaction. They suggest that nonhumans—including pets, deities, saints or angels, deceased relatives and friends, computerized office assistants such as Alexis or Siri, or avatars such as those created in computer gamers—enter our analytic frame. My study focuses on the aforementioned nonhuman entities. Using closed and open-ended survey data collected via a questionnaire developed by me and administered by Qualtrics, I am exploring a) the prevalence with which respondents report meaningful interactions with these nonhuman entities, b) how respondents describe these exchanges, c) whether perceptions of

human-nonhuman interactions vary by age, class, gender, level of education, race or religion, and d) how these relationships impact peoples' self-reported happiness, self-reported physical and mental health, and self-reported social connectedness to other human beings. The project is cross cultural, using respondents from Mexico, South Korea, and the United States. My empirical findings will also allow me to test different theories designed to explain the "workings" behind human-nonhuman relationships. The first paper from the project was published in *Socius*.

2) *Are You Sure About That? Strategies for Discerning Fact from Fiction* (co-authored with Janet M. Ruane): In this book, we review some tips on getting at the truth of any issue— understanding the players, examining the credibility of data, finding reliable places to fact check statements and identifying venues that offer biased versus balanced coverage. Then, we tackle 25 of the most common "facts" widely circulated to the general public and use grounded, reliable data to test the veracity of each statement. In some cases, we will find actual support for a statement. In others, we'll prove the statement false. And in still others, we'll show that the statement is complicated and may have elements that are correct while others are not. A proposal containing several chapters is complete and will be circulated to publishers soon.

3) *Mary of Nazareth: How is Mary's Womanhood Portrayed?* In this paper, I analyze images and statues of Mary that present her as neither Blessed or as a mother, but rather as a woman. I consider what these images say about gender ideals for those who honor Mary. I am now collecting data.
